State and Federal Programs

- 100 A. The agency that determines Medicaid eligibility for low-income children and families, and people who need institutional care.
- Q. What is Department of Children & Families (DCF)?
- 200 A. A state and federal partnership that provides health coverage for selected Florida residents who meet the program's low-income eligibility requirement.
- Q. What is Florida Medicaid?
- 300 A. A Medicaid program for people who have too much income or their assets are over the limits for Medicaid.
- Q. What is Medically Needy or Share of Cost?
- 400 A. After receiving disability benefits for 2 years, you will automatically be enrolled in this type of health insurance coverage.
- Q. What is Medicare?
- 500 A. The State of Florida's health insurance program for children. It was created through Title XXI of the Social Security Act and reauthorized in 2009. Through its four partners, including Florida Healthy Kids, the program covers children from birth through age 18.
- Q. What is Florida KidCare?

Numbers... Count Me In

- 100 A. A helpline of Palm Beach/Treasure Coast, providing crisis intervention, information, assessment and referral to community services
- Q. What is 2-1-1 (of Palm Beach & Treasure Coast)?
- 200 A. To be eligible for the Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly Program (EHEAP) which assists low-income households, when the households are experiencing a home energy emergency, at least one individual in the household must be this old.
- Q. What is 60?
- 300 A. The 2012 minimum wage in Florida.
- Q. What is \$7.67?

400 A. The amount of coinsurance Medicaid recipients, using the hospital emergency room for non-emergency services, are responsible to pay.

Q. What is five percent (5%) coinsurance on the first \$300 of the Medicaid payment?

500 A. Percentage of the federal poverty level that individuals must not exceed in order to be eligible for Project Access.

Q. What is 200%?

Home is Where the Heart Is

100 A. The largest county in the state of Florida in total area.

Q. What is Palm Beach County?

200 A. This is a coordinated system of volunteer physician care, hospital care, diagnostic services, and medication assistance for the low-income uninsured residents of Palm Beach County

Q. What is Project Access (administered by Palm Beach County Medical Society).

300 A. A resource here to help seniors and their caregivers find solutions to the many questions and challenges of growing older. Services are available to the entire community regardless of ability to pay.

Q. What is Your Aging Resource Center?

400 A. Originally focused on serving migrant and agricultural workers, this organization's mission is now more inclusive as they currently provide health, education, and outreach to the uninsured and working poor.

Q. What is the Caridad Center?

500 A. An independent taxing district that provides for an array of health care services, including: the trauma system; school health; health coverage; hospital; and skilled nursing care.

Q. What is the Health Care District of Palm Beach County?

Give Me a Compass... Great Navigation Skills

100 A. While their roles may differ a bit from one organization to the next, these individuals are generally responsible for building effective working relationships, helping to (re)solve problems, managing information, and directing patients/clients to resources.

Q. What are navigators?

200 A. Responding appropriately to a person's unique cultural differences such as race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, age, gender, sexual orientation, physical disability, values and customs.

Q. What is cultural competency?

300 A. Difficulty speaking or reading English. Difficulty communicating desires and needs. Cultural beliefs regarding treatment. Mistrust or fear of the health care system. Fatalistic feelings about their disease.

Q. What are language and cultural barriers to seeking services or care?

400 A. The thoughts, communications, actions, customs, beliefs, values, and institutions of racial, ethnic, religious, or social groups.

Q. What is culture?

500 A. Conflicts between clinic and work schedules. Not having a car or access to public transportation. Difficulty arranging reliable transportation. Living far from treatment facilities (rural areas). Difficulty finding child- or elder care.

Q. What are physical or logistical barriers to seeking services or care?

Potpourri

100 A. Program that can assist low income households, particularly those with the lowest incomes that pay a high proportion of household income for home energy, primarily in meeting their immediate home energy needs.

Q. What is the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)?

200 A. A perpetual grant-making organization dedicated to promoting a healthier population, improving access to care, facilitating development of a coordinated and collaborative health care delivery system, increasing the number of health care professionals trained and serving the County, improving sciences competency among primary and secondary school students, and improving the quality of life from the neighborhood level up by attacking root causes of public health problems.

Q. What is the Quantum Foundation?

300 A. A web-based system designed to screen and enroll applicants in multiple publicly funded health programs through a single application.

Q. What is the One-e-App?

400 A. An internet-based personal health record provided by the Florida Medicaid program for all Medicaid recipients in Florida.

500 A. The color of a Florida Medicaid identification card.
